This position is an exciting opportunity for a communications specialist with an interest in science and participatory research. It offers the opportunity to be part of a growing team in a European non-profit organisation, and to work on a number of EU-funded projects.

About us

The European Citizen Science Association (ECSA) is an interdisciplinary, non-profit organisation that promotes the democratisation of science through citizen science.

Your responsibilities will include overseeing ECSA's communications activities, extending to working on EU projects touching various fields (e.g. environmental, natural and social sciences) that have citizen science as a common theme.

Tasks

- Work on ECSA's EU-funded projects, including organising project-related events and writing reports.
- Develop dissemination strategies and communication plans, and report on their execution.
- Develop exploitation and sustainability strategies within the EU projects.
- Implement ECSA's existing communications strategy in the areas of public relations, marketing and internal communication, and coordinate all measures.
- Develop our existing social media networks and drive our digital presence (e.g. website content and maintenance); further development of our website and community platform; organise and develop our webinar series.
- Regularly monitor ECSA's communication measures.
- Support the implementation of analogue, hybrid and online events, including our conference in 2022.



- Advise on corporate communication issues and on ECSA's active positioning on topics in the context of the association.
- Contribute to ECSA's work on accessibility, visibility and inclusivity.

Requirements:

- A strong interest in science and science communication.
- A graduate in a relevant field, such as science communication, journalism, environmental governance, international relations, political science, etc.
- Familiar with current developments and central stakeholders in the field of citizen science.
- Strong communication skills and knowledge of science communication, with a track record of developing communications campaigns and/or materials for a range of audiences.
- Sound experience in digital corporate communications and social media management.
- A clear, structured and targeted group-oriented writing style.
- Ability to manage multiple strands of work and competing demands at the same time.
- A team player with a strong hands-on mentality, target-oriented work style and ability to self-reflect.
- Languages: excellent English; further European language(s) welcome.
