Martin Brocklehurst is a founding member of both the Citizen Science Global Partnership (CSGP) and the European Citizen Science Association (ECSA). Currently the Chair of the Board of the CSGP and an established Board Member of ECSA he is also an active citizen scientist. Currently working as a consortium member of the EU funded Climate Change Project AURORA designed to show how citizens can make an active contribution to reducing atmospheric carbon levels. He is an independent environmental consultant who has

worked since 2013 to foster Citizen Science Associations in Europe, Africa, Australia, and Asia. He has lectured widely on citizen science in Europe, Africa and Australia and is the main contact and adviser to the United Nations Science Policy Business Forum (UNSPBF) on citizen science.
